In the mid-1990s I started working for the NHS in the Occupational Therapy Department at the then Little High Wood long-stay hospital in Brentwood. While there, the forward-thinking department heads were developing services that would support the residents to make links into the wider community prior to the impending closure of Little High Wood. As part of that agenda, I was tasked with developing a supported employment service for people who would not be covered by any existing supported employment services. In brief, these services led to the formation of the 'rollercoaster ride' that is Frontline and our quest for the inclusion and acceptance of people of all abilities into the wider community. The challenges have been great and numerous, but so have the rewards of seeing people thrive as they realise their potential and begin to take their rightful place in the wider community. The fight is not over, and there is a long way to go to full acceptance and inclusion, but with the support and encouragement of those who share our values and, of course, our fabulous team of paid and volunteer staff, we hope to continue for many years to come.



As was said at our 20 year anniversary celebrations, our participants have educated us along the way, challenged us, inspired and encouraged us, and energized us by their success.

Beside my work for Frontline, I am wife, mother of three adult sons, and Nanny to seven fabulous grandchildren, several of whom are now taller than I am.
